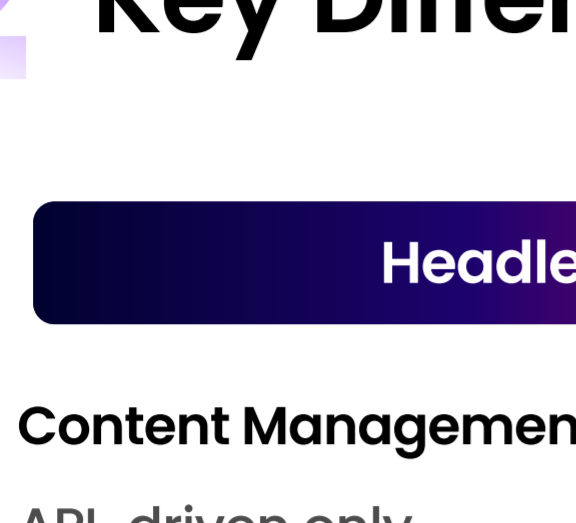

1 Definitions

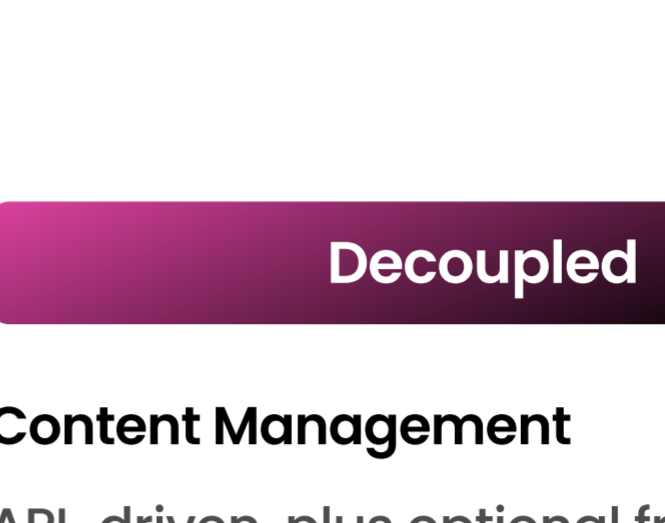
Headless

A CMS focused on content management and delivering it to various platforms through APIs, without an integrated presentation layer.



Decoupled

A CMS offering both a back-end for managing content and an optional, loosely connected front-end, providing flexibility in presentation.



2 Key Differences

Headless

Content Management

API-driven only

Flexibility

High—any front-end tech can be used

Platform Reach

Excellent for multi-platform distribution

Decoupled

Content Management

API-driven, plus optional front-end

Flexibility

Moderate—some control over front-end

Platform Reach

Good, but limited to pre-built options

Headless CMS

✓ Pros

→ Greater flexibility for developers.

→ Content can be reused across multiple platforms.

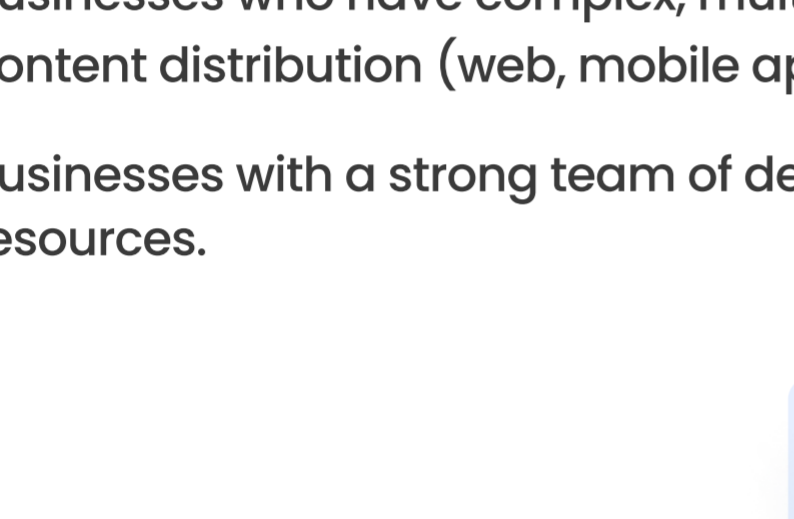

✗ Cons

→ More complex setup.

→ Requires more technical expertise.



Decoupled CMS

✓ Pros

→ Offers some front-end capabilities out of the box.

→ Easier for marketers to use and preview content.

✗ Cons

→ Less flexibility compared to Headless.

→ Businesses who have complex, multi-platform content distribution (web, mobile apps, IoT).

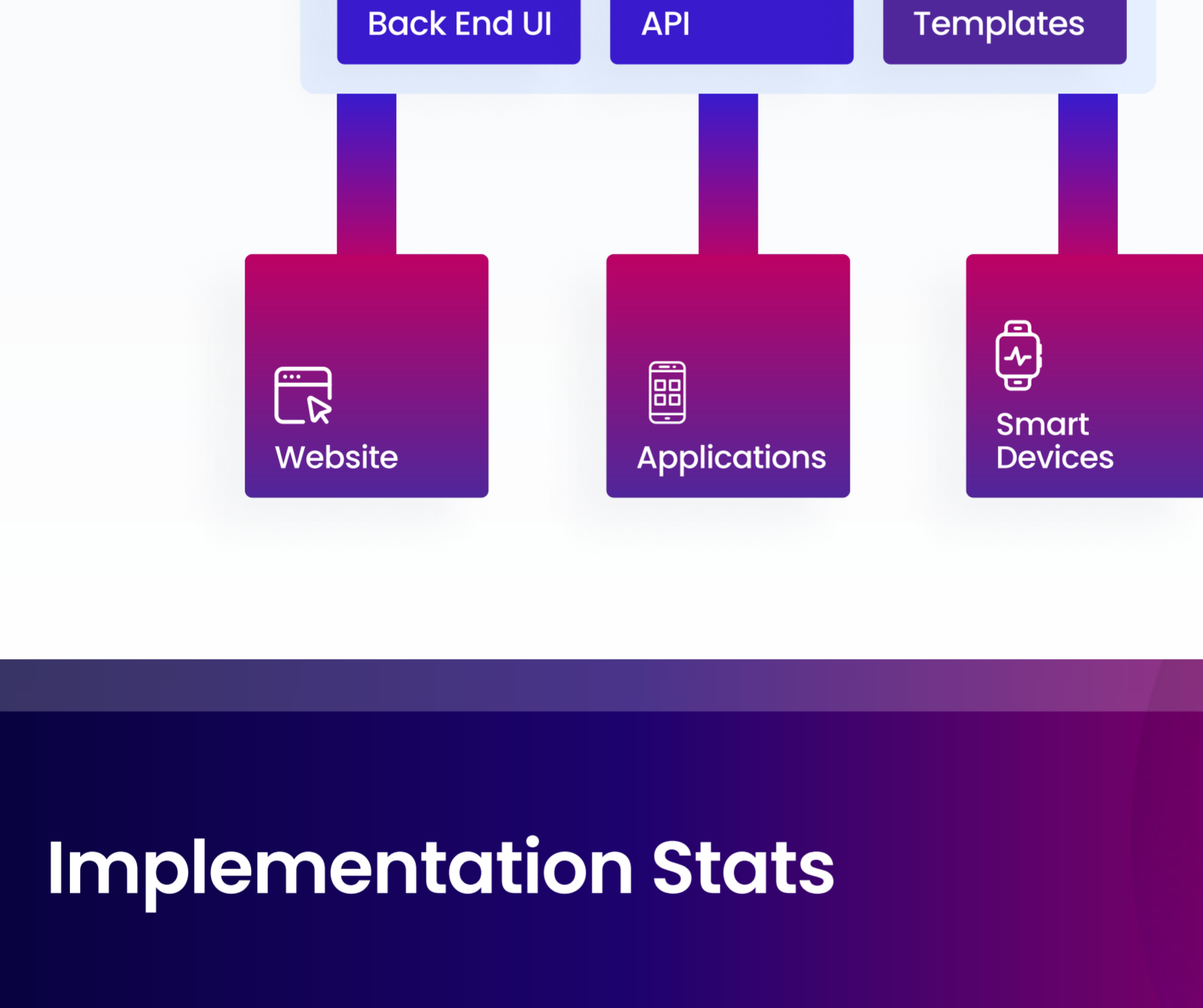
→ Businesses with a strong team of developer resources.

→ Higher upfront costs.

→ Limited flexibility for complex customizations.

→ Potentially higher maintenance.
